Set Up IMAP - iPhone™, iPad™, iPod®

To set up IMAP, do the following:

1. Tap Settings, Mail, Contacts, Calendars, Add Account, Tap Other and then Add Mail Account.



- 2. Enter the following information in the spaces provided:
  - Name—Enter your first and last name. This is the name that will appear in the **From** field of messages you send.
  - Address—Enter your entire email address above.
  - Password—Enter the password for your email account.
  - Description—Enter a descriptive name for the account (e.g., Work Account). This description will be visible only to you.
- 3. Tap the **Save** button.

**Note:** If **IMAP** is not already selected, tap the **IMAP** button.

- 4. Under both the **Incoming Mail Server** and **Outgoing Mail Server** sections, enter the following information:
  - Host Name Enter the Host Name listed above

- User Name Enter your entire email address above.
- Password Enter the password for your email account.

# Syncing your IMAP folders on your iPhone - How to subscribe to folders

If you set up the IMAP mail account on your iPhone, you may not find the IMAP folders in your Inbox folder. If this is the case, you'll need to specify the IMAP path prefix.

You can enter in the IMAP path prefix by going to Settings > Mail > Account > Advanced > IMAP Path Prefix.

Enter the word "INBOX" (use all caps) and save the setting. Now, your folders should appear as subfolders in the Inbox.

- 2. Under Mailbox Behaviors, tap Drafts Mailbox.

- 6. Tap Advanced and then Tap Deleted Mailbox.
- 7. Under **On the Server**, tap **Trash**.




1) Find and click **E-mail** on your Android phone. **OR go to Settings --- Accounts and add a new account. Standard (Personal) Imap email.** 



2) Enter your **e-mail address** and **password** and then press **Next**.




### **Configuring Your Account**

  - d. Click Next.


